Instructional Clinics

Kids ages 7-16 with little to no golf experience can learn the basics of the game while getting experience on the course. Clinics meet 3 days a week for 2 hours. Spring/Summer Fire Safety Check-Up:

- Change your smoke detector batteries.
- Remove bird nests/debris in outdoor electrical fixtures and dryer vents.
- Always store propane cylinders outside.
- Keep gas grills on a flat, level surface at least 10 feet from any building. A grill should not be used inside or under a carport or breezeway.

Make it Harder for Thieves

With the return of good weather, people spend more time outdoors and thefts from garages increase. Remember to keep your garage doors closed and locked when not in use, including the pedestrian door. Put cars, bikes and tools away before going in. Do not leave car keys in the vehicle. Finally, leave outside lights on all night to discourage trespassers.

Vacation House Check

If you are going on vacation for an extended period, call Westlake PD's non-emergency number 440-871-3311 to be put on the Vacation House Check. An officer will periodically stop by your home to see that the doors and windows are secure.

Take these additional precautions:

- Stop the mail and newspapers, or ask a neighbor to pick them up.
- Leave lights and a radio or TV on.
- Ask your neighbor to keep an eye on your residence for packages or suspicious circumstances.

Help Save Lives

Opioid drug addiction is killing Ohioans of all ages and social classes at a record pace. You are not helping your family member if you cover it up or enable it. No matter how hard it may seem, follow the advice of CEO William Denihan of the Cuyahoga County Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services when he spoke in the Westshore: "Get them arrested."

If you find suspected narcotics or drug paraphernalia, call Westlake PD to seize and safely dispose of them and get the addict into the justice system for help before it's too late.
